- Include prevention and treatment
- · Effective prevention is comprehensive
 - Addresses multiple contributors
 - At both individual and environmental levels
 - Using multiple initiatives

Encourage help-seeking behaviors

- De-stigmatize mental health problems
 - Education
 - Contact
 - Advocacy
- · Remove barriers to help-seeking
- · Enhance accessibility of MHS

Establish Crisis Management Procedures

- Establish policies and implement programs that respond to suicide attempts and high-risk behavior
- Respond with comprehensive post-vention program

Provide Mental Health Services

- Train MHS providers to identify and treat depression, threats of suicide, and other emotional disorders
- · Refer cases as appropriate
- Institute procedures (e.g., intake form)
- Engage in prevention & outreach activities
- Train personnel on confidentiality, notification, and legal issues

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Means Restriction

- Limit access to potentially lethal means
 - Buildings (towers, rooftops, balconies, windows)
 - Firearms
 - Chemicals
 - Alcohol
 - · Other drugs

Life Skills Development

- Improve students' management of the rigors of college life
- Equip students with tools to recognize and manage triggers and stressors

Social Network Promotion

- Reduce student isolation and promote feeling of belonging
- Encourage the development of smaller groups within the larger campus community

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Comprehensive Approach: Principles and Processes

- Leadership: president, campus task force
- Collaboration across campus departments
- Faculty and student involvement
- Data collection
- · Strategic planning
- Evaluation

Planning/Evaluation Process Problem Analysis/ Needs Assessment Set long-range goals Consult the literature

Select program strategies, translate these into specific activities, and plan for evaluation

Implement program activities

Evaluate whether goals were achieved
