	Bryan Adams, Active Minds			
4:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m.	Hailing from a small New Jersey town, Bryan Adams set his sights on the United States army after high school. He served a year-long deployment as a Sniper in Tikrit, Iraq. In October 2004, he was shot in the left leg and left hand during an ambush and was awarded a Purple Heart. Bryan was 21 years old when he returned from the war. He struggled to reintegrate back into society and was eventually diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. As a current Senior at		International Ballroom A B, C & D
