



Magnitude of the Problem




- 31,655 deaths by suicide in 2002
- 17,638 deaths by homicide in 2002
- 1 person every 17 minutes, 87 per day
- 11th ranking cause of death in U.S.
- 3rd leading cause of death for youth 15-24
- 4:1 male to female
