He served a year-long deployment as a Sniper in Tikrit, Iraq. In October 2004, he was shot in the left leg and left hand during an ambush and was awarded a Purple Heart. Bryan was 21 years old when he returned from the war. He struggled to reintegrate back into society and was eventually diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.
